Injection could bring Aids cure

INJECTING patients with supercharged versions of the body's own immune cells could offer a potential cure for Aids, new research

suggests. Scientists have been able to eradicate the disease in the lab using the modified cells, and plan to start clinical trials in humans within months.

Even if they don't replicate the same results they believe

that they could slow down the disease's progression, enough to offer a new treatment for the disease.

More than 73,000 people in Britain are infected with the HIV virus, which over time becomes Aids.
